

Prof. Bruno Latour (SCIENCES PO, Paris)

The philosopher, sociologist and anthropologist Bruno Latour is professor and vice-president for research at *Sciences Po* (Paris). From 1982 to 2006, he has been professor at the *Centre de sociologie de l'Innovation* at the *Ecole nationale supérieure des mines* in Paris and, for various periods, visiting professor at *UCSD*, at the *London School of Economics* and in the History of Science Department of *Harvard University*. Bruno Latour is one of the most popular and influential contemporary proponents of the *'Actor-Network-Theory'* (ATN). Especially in Germany his work has had a major impact on science studies and sociology.

In 2010, Latour received a cultural award of the academic society of Munich (Münchner Universitäts-Gesellschaft).
